He was always hard working; sometimes to a fault. He was a very loyal employee, co-worker and friend to many. There are many new chefs that have been touched by his

intelligence, courage and mentoring that have started their own careers with his help. His culinary genius will touch many for years to come. He has worked many different venues including hotels, convention centers, restaurants, college instructor and corporate life with Publix.

His next passion was cars. No one will ever forget his infamous Shelby. Many days have been spent with grand prix and Nascar racing. Or tinkering with whatever car needed attention in the front driveway or yard.
