Archbishop David Scott passed away peacefully on January 15, 2024, in Altamonte Springs, Florida at the age of 71.

David is survived by his wife (Becky), his two sons and their wives (Erick and Juleen & Jason and Elizabeth), his sister (Pamela), his two nephews (Bryan and Devin), and his two nieces (Teka and Charlotte)

David was born in Dallas, Texas on May 8, 1952, he is the son of Jack M. Scott and Patricia A. Scott. He graduated from Logos Graduate School in 2006 with a Doctor of Divinity. He married Rebecca C. Scott (Becky) on July 26, 1975.

David took pride and loved being born and raised in Texas. It's where he and his sister Pam made lasting childhood memories and where he met his lifelong good friend, David Rutherford. The two of them have been friends since grade school and not one Dallas Cowboy game went by without the two of them getting together to either watch it and/or discuss the good the bad and the ugly, no matter the distance between them.
