Betty Lee Kinzer Date, 83, Longwood, passed away Wednesday, June 30. She was born in Christiansburg, Virginia to Henry Brinson Kinzer and Louise Ratcliffe Kinzer. She attended Radford University in Radford, Virginia and graduated with a degree in English from Barry College in Miami, Florida. She and her husband, Paul, moved to Miami Shores in 1958, where they raised three daughters. Mrs. Date was a portrait artist. Her work has been featured in numerous art shows and has received many awards. Her talent was greatly appreciated at Miami Shores Presbyterian Church, where she created, designed, and painted the first scenes of the church's Living Nativity. She was a Stephen Minister and the first female deacon at MSPC. She was a member of P.E.O., the Miami Garden Club, and other civic organizations in Miami. She was also a wonderful, prize-winning photographer, with her daughters, and later her grandchildren, as frequent subjects. A loving wife and mother, sister and friend, she is survived by her husband, Paul, and her three daughters, Betty Clark (Mike) of Altamonte Springs, Jane McCann (John) of Longwood, Cathy Gendreau of Apopka, and nine grandchildren.
