Brenda “Bunny” Feldman passed away at 74 years old on February 24, 2018, following a sudden, but brief, illness. The family she cherished surrounded her.

Brenda, a 27-year survivor of breast cancer and proud supporter of breast cancer research and the Jewish community, is survived by her beloved husband of over 47 years, Lawrence, her sons Richard, Jonathan (Jenifer), and Joel (Allison), and her grandchildren Ethan, Anna, Everett, and Micah. Her son Michael predeceased her.
