Charleen Claire (Moran) Nash, a beloved wife, mother, daughter, sister, aunt, grandmother, and friend, left us peacefully on November 20, 2025, at the age of 82 in her hometown of Longwood, Florida. She grew up in Oakland and after high school, decided to pursue her passion for helping others at St. Joseph's College of Nursing in San Francisco earning her degree in 1964. 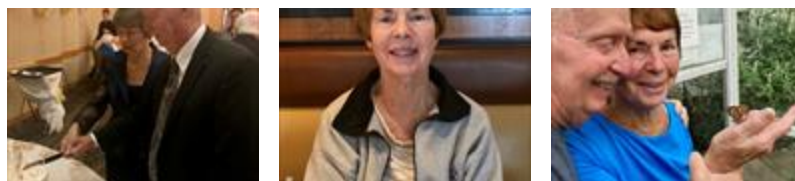
