Charlotte was deeply committed to her Christian faith and found solace and friendship with her Jehovah Witness congregation. Always generous to a fault; giving when there was little to give, she remained true to her faith.

She was preceded in death by two brothers, David A. Thompson and Richard E. Thompson. She is survived by two sisters, Katherine (Alan) Halperin and

Janice (Jimmy) Hinton, brother Walter Jr. (Anne) Thompson, niece Jennifer Carter, great nephew Dylan Ashby, and multiple nieces and nephews in Atlanta and Colorado Springs.

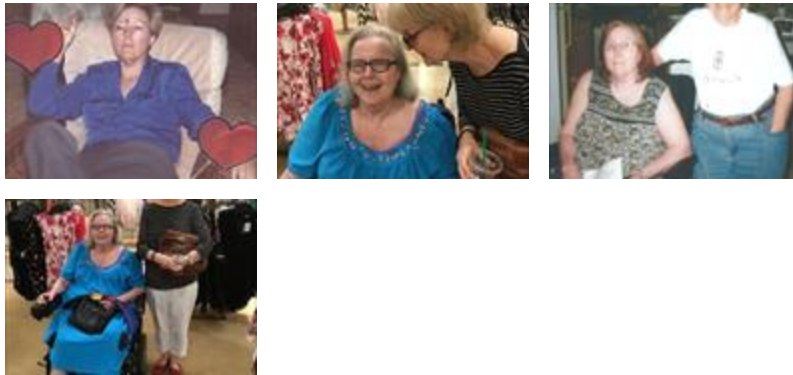
