the Air Force as a Medical NCO in Northern Solomons, Bismark Archipelago, New Guinea, and Philippine Liberation during WWII evacuating wounded soldiers from the warfront. He received a Good Conduct Medal and Air Medal GO 138 Hq USAFISPA 26 Jan 44. He was discharged May 5, 1945 and returned home to meet his WWII pen pal, Adele, and married her in September of 1945. Theirs was a love story worthy of the big screen. A love and marriage that spanned 69 years. He was a member of the United Church of Christ, Fogelsville, Pa., and the Tuskawilla Presbyterian Church in Oviedo, Florida.

He was a contradiction of terms, hard and crusty on the outside and soft and mushy on the inside. A man of deep thought, strong emotion and conviction, and great love.
