



## Franklin Gilbert Mosley

March 7, 1946 - March 29, 2022

Franklin Gilbert Mosley, 76, of Altamonte Springs, Florida, passed away on March 29, 2022. He was born on March 7, 1946 to James and Theresa Mosley in Charleston, West Virginia. He was in Boy Scouts and had fond memories of fishing, camping and hunting with his father. He moved to College Park in Orlando with his family when he was a teenager. He graduated from Edgewater High School and Rollins College with a Bachelor Degree in Finance/Accounting.

Frank retired in October 2014 from the State of Florida Department of Revenue after 23 years of service. He was previously employed at WFTV Channel 9 as well as Florida Gas Company (before it was merged with Enron) and Minute Maid. His hobbies included painting, photography and golf.
