Harry W. Marlow born February 14, 1924 at Holder, Florida; passed away October 4th at Dunnellon, Florida after a long and courageous battle with cancer. Mr. & Mrs. Marlow moved to Dunnellon after residing in Pinellas Park, Florida for over 55 years where he was an active member of the Pinellas Park community serving the City on numerous boards and committees. He was honored as Citizen of the Year and served as President of the Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Marlow was a Professional Land Surveyor; highly respected by his peers. In 1964 he began his own firm, Harry W. Marlow, Inc., in Pinellas Park, with Progress Energy as its main client. He ran the business until he was 81 years old. He was proud to have worked in the profession he loved for sixty-one and a half years.

Mr. Marlow was a faithful member of the Church of Christ. One of the most meaningful things in his life was being a founding member of the Skyview Church of Christ in Pinellas Park. He later worshipped with the 14th Avenue Church of Christ and, since moving to Dunnellon, with West Citrus Church of Christ.

Mr. Marlow is survived by his loving and devoted wife of 65 years, Eloise. They worked together, side by side to study the scriptures, worship God, raise a family and run a business. They met in Perry, FL where he said it was love at first sight that never ended. Sadly, their youngest son, Stephen E. Marlow, preceded Mr. Marlow in death. Surviving children are son Harry, Jr. (Dona) of

St. Petersburg; daughter Ginny Shields (Richard) of Dunnellon; grandchildren Jeff Shields of Dunnellon, Stacy Prpich (John) of Lithia, Craig Marlow (Julie) of Elgin, SC, Blake Marlow, Portland, Oregon, Brett Marlow, Chicago, Ill. And great-grandchildren, Shylou, Noah , Jacob, Hunter and Harrison. Also, a sister Doris Wilder and brother Ron Marlow and many dearly loved nieces and nephews.
