



Hugh Charles Green Jr.

September 12, 1946 - June 15, 2017

The Reverend Dr. Hugh Charles (Chuck) Green, Jr., beloved son, husband, father and founding Pastor of Orangewood Presbyterian Church in Maitland, FL passed away on Thursday, June 15, 2017. Born on September 12, 1946 in Huntington West Virginia, Chuck was raised in Ft. Madison, IA, where at 16 he incurred a paralyzing trampoline accident. Chuck would go on to graduate from Jacksonville University earning a degree in marketing. He took his first job with Merrill Lynch as a stock broker in Miami where he heard and faithfully answered God's call on his life. Chuck earned his Master of Divinity degree from Reformed Theological Seminary in Jackson, MS, and subsequently started Orangewood in 1976 in downtown Orlando. Moving the church to Maitland a few years later, God used Chuck to touch countless lives during his 20 years of service as Senior Pastor. He faithfully maintained his commitment to the Lord in the years to follow.

Chuck is predeceased in life by his parents, Hugh and Eloise Green. He is survived by his wife Linda, his son David Green, his daughter Holly Wheeler and her husband Kevin, his grandchildren Chloe Green, Cason and Charis Wheeler, his sisters Kelly Trabucco and husband Larry, Bette Goldmann and her husband Steve, his nephew Matt Trabucco and wife Tina, their two children Tyler and Colin, and many other extended members of his cherished family.

A celebration of Chuck's life will be held Saturday, June 24 at 1:00pm at Orangewood Presbyterian Church. Donations can be made to the church in memory of Chuck Green.

On a Saturday night in that year around 10:00 pm, Holly and I pulled out the Yellow Pages and continued our search for a Presbyterian Church in the area, having just moved to Central Florida. I found the Orangewood ad, noticed it was nearby, but could not find Trinity Woods Lane on my map. So I called the church expecting to get a recording with service times and directions to the church. To my surprise, Chuck answered the phone! We talked for about 30 minutes about the church, Jesus Christ, and our lives.

Over the years that followed, Chuck had a significant impact in developing our relationship Jesus Christ and His Church. His sermons touched every facet of life and I always thought he was speaking directly to me, which was comforting but at time bothersome. Being a builder, we referred to the individual experience of Chuck's sermons as being "hit with a 2x4" by the Pastor. In other words, Chuck knocked us back on course. Of the many life lessons he presented from the pulpit, our entire family remembers his message to teenagers, which also was prudent for the entire congregation: "If you think something is wrong...it's wrong."

We are so deeply saddened to find out about Chuck's passing. However, we know where he is now. Upon hearing of this, Holly said, "God welcomed a true Saint to heaven last week. Chuck led so many people to Christ that when he arrived, God probably had named one of those magnificent heavenly streets after Chuck!" Amen!

Unfortunately, we will not be able to attend the memorial service on Saturday, as we will be out of the country. We will be there in spirit.
