In her younger years, she taught nursery and preschool. More recently, she rocked babies at Stepping Stones Preschool at their church, St. Stephen Lutheran. was such a huge presence, leading with wit, strength, fortitude, passion and zeal. She rose to challenges. She climbed mountains with determination, assisting others alongside.
