Lenore M. (Carbo) Bentley, 98, died peacefully at Advent Health Hospice Care in Orlando, Florida on February 27, 2022. She was predeceased by her husband of 51 years, Leslie C. Bentley, and her son Wayne Bentley.

Lenore M. Bentley was born on April 25, 1923 in Kensington, Connecticut to Joseph J. Carbo and Marguerite A. (Erwin) Carbo where she attended local schools. In 1942 she married Master Sgt. Leslie C. Bentley. She lived briefly in Arizona and Connecticut. The family moved to Florida in 1950 where they lived in several towns for over 72 years. Mount Dora is where Lenore resided the past 10 years of her life.
