And even though they became scattered from Trinidad to Anguilla, Canada, and Orlando, she made it her business to know what was happening in their lives at all times.

Leaving Trinidad in 1988 Martha and Don spent a short two years in Toronto Canada which proved to be a little too cold after so many years in the Caribbean. They decided to move south and settled in Orlando very close to their daughter Trish and her husband Dean where they spent the next twenty-four years enjoying the warmth of Orlando and the many friendships, they developed especially among the Trinidadian diasporas.

Martha was not the tallest lady in the room, but she certainly had the biggest heart when it came to her family, and friends. She was a woman of deep faith with a marvelous sense of humor and loved to laugh. Martha will be remembered for her unwavering love, boundless generosity, and the joy she brought to all who knew her, she loved life to the very end.
