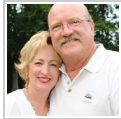

I will never forget the day, probably almost 35 years ago, when she knocked on our carport door, and offered a heavenly loaf of fresh baked sourdough bread. The door had barely closed behind her before the boys and I had polished off the entire loaf. She repeated this generous gesture for several weeks, before I realized that one loaf of bread was just not enough for us. She willingly shared some of her starter with me, and I started creating my own weekly loaves of bread. This continued for years, until I somehow forgot to feed it for a couple of weeks. I had shared the starter with a friend in Georgia, but she somehow had also let her starter die. But, she had shared her starter with her sister in Indiana. So....she retrieved some starter from Indiana, and I retrieved some from her in Georgia, and the starter is still happily bubbling along in my refrigerator. It produces three loaves of delicious bread every week, that I have been able to share with multitudes of friends and family through the years. What better gift could your mother have given me those many years ago? She is a hero to my family!! She was such a good neighbor, and good person. She will be greatly missed!*
