Together, Pat and Ken set a strong example of a long, loving marriage between two people who genuinely adored each other. Like her mother, Gloria, It's A Small World was Pat's favorite ride- a sweet, colorful, idealistic vision of the world, not necessarily as it is, but as we would wish it- a perfectly "Pat" ride. We'll always think of her when we hear that famous (some say "infamous") song.

Everyone knows the chorus, but the lesser known lyrics don't get the attention they deserve- "there is just one moon and one golden sun and a smile means friendship to everyone. Though the mountains divide and the oceans are wide, it's a small world after all." With that in mind, we'll try to do a little something to make the real world a little more "small world" for Pat every day.

Towards the end of her life when things were hard and she couldn't focus to answer simple questions from the nurses and doctors, no matter how sick she was, she could always answer one question, "Who is the President?" With the

same tenacity she always had, as though everything was ok with her, she would say his name with anger--lol!
