She loved music and was often singing. She also loved to laugh and was often the life of the party. There was frequently a dog by her side--she

loved animals deeply. She loved horses, as well, and as a young woman, she was an accomplished equestrian.

She will be missed very much by family, friends, and all those she touched during her amazing life.

She was preceded in death by her parents and her siblings, Thomas Heenan and Joan Canal Schoeffel. surviving relatives include two nieces, Alicia Canal and Christy Cerrato, and two nephews, Al Canal and John Canal.
