Randy Boyd Chambliss, “The Keystone Elf”, 67, of Uniontown, PA, after a fourteen-year battle with carcinoid cancer, passed peacefully on January 10, 2024, at home with his wife, Suzanne, by his side.

Randy was born on July 29, 1956, in Atlanta, Georgia the son of Hiram Chambless and Elizabeth Susan (Williamson) Chambless. He is preceded in death by his parents, two brothers, one sister, and his mother-in-law and close friend, Donna Ingrassia.

Randy proudly served in the United States Marine Corp and then later as a Boy Scout Troop Master.

Randy truly enjoyed life. He loved to be silly, laugh, and play. All who were blessed to know him know that he never passed up an opportunity to make someone smile – ever! Other things he enjoyed include butterflies, his momma’s cornbread, roller-skating, bowling, musicals, everything Pokémon, watching wrestling, swapping bad dad jokes, and playing any kind of game with family and friends. In November of 2021, he got to experience Disney World for the first time, where he really was free to be a kid again.
