“ Dear Tom,

I was stunned to learn of your passing from our 2 SWS squadron mate Mark Collison. That assignment, of course, is where we first met -- you the Ops Officer and me an in-coming Flight Commander from the Royal Canadian Air Force. Back then we were Crew Commanders but that wasn't good enough for you. You challenged the Space Command establishment and instead of Crews, re-labeled us as Flights and the former "crew commanders" as Flight Commanders. This lone move boosted morale among the team like nothing else. But you didn't stop there: you and the Ops Supt - Fred Glaze - created this weird rotation schedule for the ops Flights that saw one flight working 6 on 4 off on straight mids and other Flights on straight swings and straight days. Nobody thought this would work. You would never get anyone to work straight mids on a 6/4 schedule. But you trusted the people and we had more volunteers for the mid Flight than any of the others and it worked. Once again, morale soared thanks to your willingness to give it a shot. You challenged all of us to be better not just at our jobs, but in life. You challenged me with appointments in the squadron for an RCAF officer that was unheard of ahead of USAF officers. You always reminded me of your tour at the Pentagon supporting the Canada US Permanent Joint Board on Defense. Who would have thought that a T-38 Instructor pilot would have such effect on the defense of both Canada and the US.

I remember you telling me you wanted to be the first to know when I became a US Citizen so you could bring me on board at Lockheed Martin. I think you were crushed at first when I told you that you would not be the FIRST to know, but that I would tell my wife and Mom first -- so in that case you came in third. I am pretty sure you were ok with it in that case.

Our time at Lockheed was just great. You showed me the ropes of working in the defense industry at the largest defense company and what a ride it was. We came so close to cracking the nut on the space training business but, alas, it was not to be. I remember the last time we saw each other -- my departure luncheon from Lockheed December of 2012. I think we talked one or two more

times after that, but we drifted, faded. I regret that and, in the vernacular of today's youth -- My Bad.

Kristine, family, please know that Tom was a great influence in my life in the military and post-military. We have crossed paths in the past and through modern media, I was able to watch the Funeral Mass and the Interment Ceremony from links on this page and kind of "be there" even a bit after the fact. God Bless all of you, keep you, and God Bless the soul of Tom Shircliff.
