Waymon F. Singleton, 82, of Maitland, FL, formerly of Tallahassee, FL entered into eternal life on Monday, February 5, 2018. He was born May 29, 1935 in Tallahassee.

Waymon was preceded in death by his father, Terry Waymon Singleton; mother Easter Forrest Singleton; and two sisters, Dorothy Ann Savage and Mary Etta Trimble.

changes. He retired in 1990 and worked part-time for his son, Terry, until he fully retired in 2011.
